38th Annual Study Conference, Sheffield 2007



This year our annual study conference takes place in Sheffield, which we are visiting for the first time since 1980.

This year's conference again covers a wide range of topics that should mean that there is plenty to interest everybody within it. It is particularly good to see that new and emerging areas such as Web 2.0 and wikis are being addressed, as they are subjects that I see being mentioned with increasing frequency but probably don't understand anywhere near as well as I should. This year the keynote address, given by Adrian Dale, will comprise the Willi Steiner Memorial Lecture. This is the first time the lecture has taken place as part of the conference, and we hope that it will be the start of a new tradition.

This is the second time the conference will be using the Thursday to Saturday format which should make travelling to and from the event simpler, or give you the opportunity to take some time at the end of it to explore the nearby Peak District.

As with last year, the parallel sessions on Friday will run only once and will have an academic, law firm, or workplace theme, with time to network with colleagues and suppliers built in to the schedule.

The Strategic Review has moved on again and, with our financial position more secure now than it has been for some years, and various other matters addressed, we have progressed to the structure and functions of Council. Some exciting proposals have been brought forward and you will have the chance to discuss them at Members' Forum and vote on them at the AGM. This year changes to the Constitution are being proposed, which is something that hasn't happened for some 13 years.

We shall again be looking forward to our social events, without which conference just wouldn't be the same. The Association dinner on Friday night will include the presentation of the Wildy's Law Librarian of the Year Award, the Legal Journals Award and the Customer Relations Award. We would also like to thank Sweet & Maxwell for being our first Platinum Sponsor of the conference.

BIALL will, as usual, be playing host to a number of overseas visitors from our sister associations such as AALL, CALL, OSALL, ALLG and Juriconnexion, and we hope you will make them feel very welcome.

By Coach

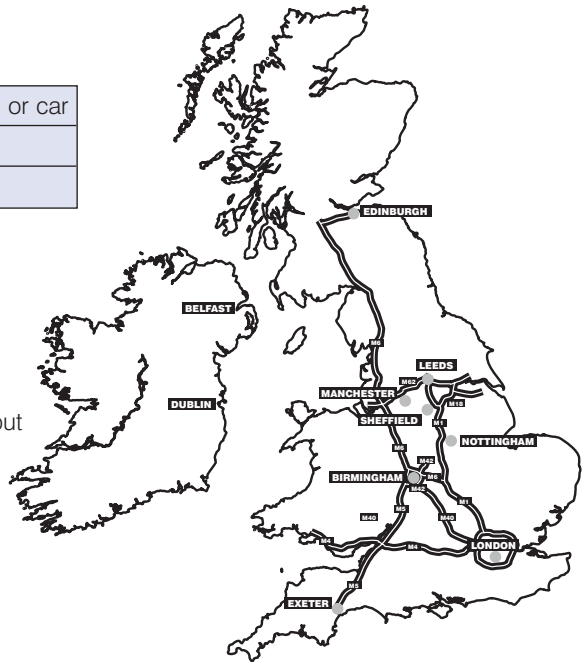
National Express operates a comprehensive coach service to most parts of the country from Sheffield Transport Interchange, Pond Street.

“Negotiating the EU legislative maze”

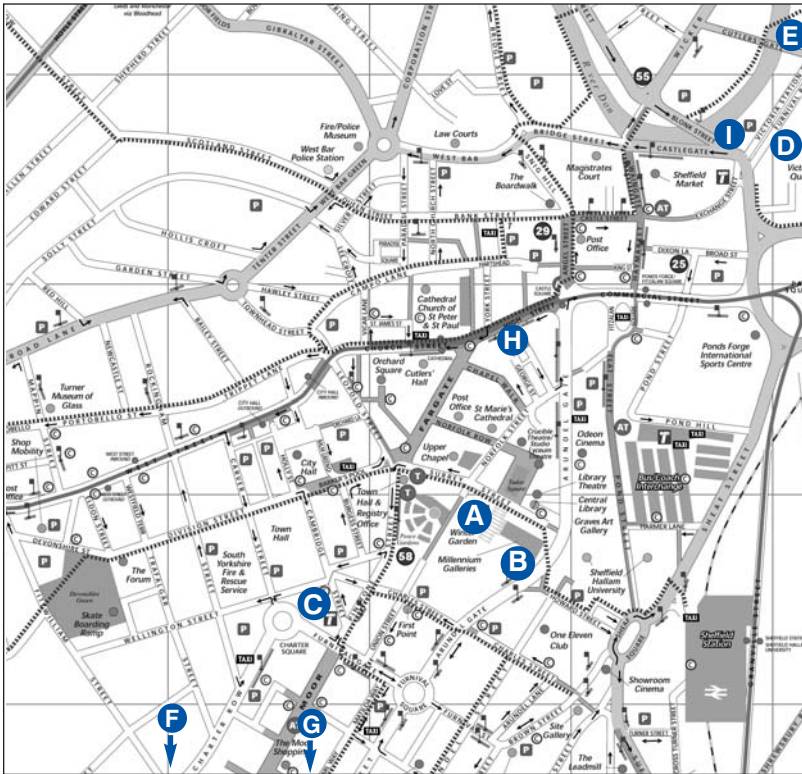

Rutland is a small friendly hotel which can be found in the vibrant student area of the city close to Sheffield University, Broomhill bars, shops and restaurants, and the Botanical gardens. A 25 minute walk along West Street or 10 minute bus ride will bring delegates to the City Hall.

Grosvenor, Cutlers, Novotel and St Pauls provide city centre accommodation in the pedestrians zone close to shops, bars, restaurants and the peace gardens, within very easy walking distance of the conference venue and close to bus, rail and tram routes.

Hilton, Holiday Inn and Bristol provide accommodation on the outskirts of the city centre, close to motorway links and adjacent to the city ring road, and within 15 minutes walking distance of the conference venue and the railway station in the quieter part of the city centre.
